



Say No to Abuse and Violence

There is also the issue of considering family and domestic violence as being part of the broader problem of the widespread abuse and violence in our community.

The ABS Personal Safety Survey (2005) found that a large number of men (10.8%) were the victims of violence in the past 12 months, which is almost double that of women (5.8%).

Elder abuse is a serious problem that is only beginning to be addressed.

Bullying amongst children is another important area to be addressed in a broad approach to eliminating abuse and violence.

Road rage is a more recent manifestation of the widespread nature of the problem.

All forms of abuse and violence have a devastating impact on the victim.

Background information on MAN
